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RECTOR'S EASTER MESSAGE


Dearly Beloved

One of my responsibilities is to counsel patients, patients parents and staff while they are experiencing challenges in their lives. I also conduct Memorial Services when a long term patient has passed on while in hospital. This is to help the patient's family and staff through the grieving process.



PARISH STRATEGIC PLAN

Some of you will remember that in 2014 we developed a Strategic Plan called Vision 2020. At the end of February we completed the review of this plan and decided to refocus our plans in line with the Rector's and called it Vision 2025.

We retained the seven Focus Areas namely:

- Admin and Governance
- Fundraising
- Stewardship and Spirituality
- Property and Plant Maintenance
- Communication
- Social Responsibility
- Training and Development

The Parish Councillors will be taking responsibility of leading each of the portfolios and will approach some of you to assist them in this important work to ensure that our Strategic Plan is a success.

In his Vision Statement to Vestry on 11 March 2018, the Rector identified the following objectives under each portfolio:

Amin and Governance

- Review of Funeral and Wedding Fees (Vestry 2018)
- Review of Pledge System by 30 June 2018
- Total completion of Parish Roll by 31 Oct. 2018
- Leadership Training 10 November 2018

Fundraising

- Encourage giving during 2018
- Appoint a Fundraising coordinator by end March
- Thanks Giving Envelope 25 November 2018

Stewardship and Spirituality

- Parish Quiet days on 12 May and 18 August 2018
- Spiritual Growth Enhanced
 - Preaching
 - Lenten Journey
 - Area Prayer Meetings
 - Weekly Prayer Groups (CtM/CtG)
 - Ministry Involvement
- Approach Local Government to obtain the land adjacent to the current Rectory for possible future development of a new Rectory.
- Youth or Parish Worker to establish a vibrant youth group - 2018/2019

Property and Plant Maintenance

Communication

- Install new Audio System (CtG) by 31 May 2018
- Functioning Hymn Boards at (CtM & CtG) by 30 May 2018
- Invite parishioners to donate 3 x 55' Flat screen and 2 x 67' Flat screen TV's for display of liturgies in church (CtM). Make: Samsung. This will help us become paperless for our services by end 2018

Social Responsibility

- Establish a Grief Support Group by 3 March 2018
- Encourage a unified approach by the AWF, MU and Social Responsibility Group during 2018
- Investigate the viability of an Anti-Drug Support Group for parents of addicts during 2018
- Engage with Local Government for the possible future development of Night Shelters in Mitchell's Plain with the express aim to remove people sleeping along streets and alleyways. This should have a positive impact on the elimination of certain crimes -2018
