# The Rector's Christmas & New Year Message

When Philip, one of the disciples asked Jesus to show them the Father who was invisible, Jesus told him, "he who has seen me has seen the Father" as he was "the image of the invisible God." (John 14:8-9). Jesus has come to show who God is. The teaching of Jesus about God as the 'Father' is a revolutionary idea at a time when the Jews were so afraid of him as a strict Judge, 'eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth' a type of judgement or punishment. But Christ said that he is like a father , forgiving and loving and caring for us like his children. The fatherhood idea of God was thought of much at that time. Such an invisible God made visible in the life of Christ.

Billy Graham once said: "If you wish to converse with the ants you must come down to their level." God did just that. He came down to our level to live like us here on earth. Thank God, he knows our problems, our challenges and our sufferings. Let us this CHRISTMAS season renew our faith in our God, who is Immanuel (Christ with us). My dear friends, God is with us in all our circumstances. Let us not forget to turn to him. He will help us.

- What are the NEGATIVE things that I have and my decision to put them away one by one?


Meet our new Lay Ministers: Keenan Lodewyk, Bonita Twigg and Pouglas Edom. We pray that God will bless them in their ministry.
